

WHAT IS ECMO?

ECMO is a special form of advanced life support used to treat the sickest patients. By putting a patient on ECMO, it gives temporary life-support with extra time for the heart or lungs, or both, to recover and repair themselves when conventional treatments are failing in conditions that are reversible.

You have been given this leaflet because someone you care about is in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) and is being considered or is on a treatment known as Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation (ECMO).

HOW DOES ECMO WORK?

During ECMO, the patient's own heart and lungs are rested. The blood is given oxygen by an artificial lung (called an oxygenator) and is circulated around the body by an external pump.

A medical specialist puts two tubes in the major blood vessels in the neck, groin or chest. These tubes are connected to the ECMO machine. Blood passes from a large vein, via tubing, through the pump and oxygenator. It is then pumped back via tubing into the patient's blood circulation.

WHAT IS VECMOS?

The Victorian ECMO Service (VECMOS) is a state-wide collaboration of hospitals in partnership with Ambulance Victoria, that provides ECMO for critically ill people.

Patients who require ongoing care may transfer to a Victorian ECMO Service site. Being transferred to another hospital is a normal part of care.

The service has been established to

deliver timely, accessible and expert ECMO patient care by creating a network of hospitals in the state that provide accredited ECMO initiation, transport and subsequent care in a coordinated and governed system.

Caring for critically ill people throughout Victoria who have reversible acute lung and heart failure.
